

THE ECONOMY BEFORE 1850

THE BRITISH SETTLEMENT of Australia in 1788 was a project fraught with risks. The organisation of the first fleet, with most persons in chains and a small contingent of military and civil officials sent 12 000 miles in tiny sailing ships, exposed the settlement to extraordinary risks, from starvation, illness and local black populations. Inevitably, the information about Australian Aborigines in the first sixty-odd years of settlement is almost non-existent. For the Europeans, there is an exceptional amount of information, a great deal of it statistical. This chapter conveys something of this numerical record before the discovery of gold. It represents some indication of the nature of the workforce of the settlements, the arrivals of convicts and free settlers, the economic activities they developed to support themselves and the very heavy expenditure by the British government—whether by design or unwittingly—to make the settlement a success.

The original Sydney settlement soon spread, first to Norfolk Island, then to Van Diemen's Land (Tasmania), Moreton Bay (Queensland), and Port Essington (Northern Territory). Free settlements were established on the Swan River (Western Australia) in 1827 and in Adelaide in South Australia in 1836. Settlement was extended to Port Phillip in the mid-1830s but it was not until after 1850 that this became recognised as Victoria. Until 1850, New South Wales extended into the present Queensland, Victoria and the modern New South Wales, and the statistics need to be read with this in mind. The four recognised and continuing settlements were this enlarged area of New South Wales, Tasmania, South Australia and Western Australia.

The Napoleonic Wars held the development of the original Sydney settlement severely in check. Nevertheless, as the records of the commissariat disclose, Britain poured resources of cash into the colony to make it a wealthy, if isolated, community. Shortage of women also limited the growth of local population. After 1815, the settlements of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land grew at prodigious rates. Together, these two colonies formed interdependent economies. From 1813 exploration across the Blue Mountains from Port Jackson opened New South Wales and Port Phillip to grazing, while climatic conditions in Van Diemen's Land encouraged the production of grains. Van Diemen's Land became the first Australian granary, securing basic food supplies, while New South Wales was able to specialise in pastoralism. Prior to 1850, South Australian ventures were concentrated on mining, while Western Australia remained a tiny isolated community.

This settlement of Australia occurred at the expense of the Aborigines. The Europeans occupied Aboriginal lands, absorbed and destroyed Aboriginal resources; some supported and others killed Aborigines; and many unwittingly carried disease to which Aborigines were highly susceptible. Little is known with any certainty about the degree of the Aboriginal demographic disaster; the statistics present two competing possibilities, of which one is still a speculative reconstruction and the other (described as conventional) is logically untenable. Whatever the truth may be, the early history of Australia was composed of two conflicting experiences—that of a declining Aboriginal population and that of an extremely rapidly increasing European community.

So far as Europeans are concerned, the statistical record is quite prolific. Governors were expected to return information to Britain; private records amplify the official information, additionally, Britain sent official investigators. From all this, we can be reasonably confident about the flows of convicts and free migrants to Australia, the former growing rapidly from 1815 and the latter becoming prominent after 1830. The transfer of these people from Britain was heavily subsidised by the British government and the information on public finance, particularly of the commissariats, is particularly important in indicating the extent to which Britain supported the standard of living of the settlements. Nevertheless, the colonies were expected to support themselves, increasingly so as pressures for public economy grew in post-Napoleonic Britain. The data given on colonial fund and land fund revenues show this increasing shift to local self-support. In the process, there was considerable tension between the colonists and Britain. British subsidies to the colonies provided the foundations of wealth for a relatively small proportion who had most to lose from the shift of public funding from Britain to the colonies. This shift increased rapidly from the late 1820s. The tensions between Britain and Australia were not resolved until Britain surrendered title in crown land to the colonies in the 1850s.

The settlements were far from being simply dependent on Britain. Local activity grew rapidly. In particular, in New South Wales, as inland settlement flowed south to Port Phillip and north to Moreton Bay, colonial government largely lost control of the expanding mainland settlement. There is therefore a gap in the statistical record so far as pastoral and agricultural activity is concerned. Though information on agriculture is available in the 1830s, the record of pastoral activity was not restored until the 1840s due to the operations of taxation on livestock. Despite the gaps in the record, the enormous expansion of white activity in the period is adequately displayed.

The history books are preoccupied with this pastoral expansion in New South Wales, the growth of grain production in Van Diemen's Land and mining in South Australia. This conventional interpretation is more directly challenged in the next chapter, on national accounts, in which are presented estimates of the major components of the economies of each colony. It is not possible to display adequately here the increasing sophistication of the Australian colonies. It is reasonably certain from musters that a great many complex activities developed and that Sydney soon became not merely a port town but a community providing many craft products and services to the expanding settlement. Musters do not make up statistical series. Here we must be content with the sophistication implied by the growth of banking activity. We can be reasonably certain that the notion of colonies dependent simply on rural activity is unacceptable, and that a great variety of economic activity developed at a very early stage.

Rapid expansion tends to be unstable. The colonies were subjected to severe depression in the early 1840s and this shows in the statistics. What is novel in the data given here is the linkage of this depression with British economic conditions. The link existed not merely and perhaps not primarily through trade and pastoral production but through public finance, with Britain drastically curbing its expenditure on Australia in the late 1830s. Australia even during that period formed part of an international financial system. After the depression, as the statistics show, the Australian colonies recovered rapidly. The discovery of gold in 1851 is usually thought of as the trigger to renewed expansion.






POTATO PRICES, VAN DIEMEN'S LAND 1828-1846


