

## CHAPTER 17

# CRIME AND JUSTICE

**C**RIME IS ONE OF THE OLDEST social problems. Two factors have made crime look like a creation of contemporary society: the development of a system of record keeping on crime and punishment, and publicity about crime. In spite of these, no society has yet been able to measure accurately and reliably the volume of crime and to identify trends in criminal activity. This chapter presents crime and justice statistics for Australia as developed by European settlers.

European settlement in Australia began as a means of administering and inflicting punishment, and at first the convict population far outnumbered the European non-convict population. The early years of colonisation were dominated by the convict status of the population and the military administration. Records on criminal incidents and punishment, especially a formal and regular statistical series, were understandably lacking. But, the gold rushes attracted free settlers to the Australian colonies, and many of the trappings of European civilisation came with them, including bureaucratic requirements to furnish returns on every branch of government activity, including criminal justice. It is difficult, however, to trace the exact date when a particular criminal justice statistical series began. A search through volumes of blue books, statistical registers, parliamentary papers, periodic returns to England, and other such papers reveals no continuous series on any aspect of crime and justice in the colonies until about the 1850s. Perhaps the availability of a continuous series since that time is coincidental with the introduction of major changes in the administration of the colonies in 1854. This does not apply to Queensland, the last colony carved out of New South Wales in 1859, at which time record keeping began. Most of the tables in this chapter, therefore, commence from 1860.

Some observations can nonetheless be made about crime and justice prior to 1860. Historical documents are full of information on the principles, philosophy and attitudes of the rulers of the colony, and the idiosyncrasies of governors of the day. In a volume containing statistical tables from Tasmania for the period 1804 to 1823, along with accounts of population, agricultural operations, wages, prices of provisions and so on, there appear some details of arrivals of convict ships, the treatment of bushrangers, executions of convicts and examples of other types of punishment given. Statistical tables for 1804 note that, 'the rations of the convicts who did not attend divine service were stopped'. The same tables reflect on the 'problem' of Aborigines. On 3 May 1804, these tables note the 'first hostile collision between the settlers and the Aborigines: as many as 50 of the latter killed'. In the following year 'the Aborigines became troublesome and

attacked the camp near the present hospital; and also at Risdon, where 40 to 50 were killed'. This preoccupation with Aborigines continued and the statistical tables of 1807 notes the murder of the first white man by the natives. In 1815 the Aborigines were 'killed in great numbers, so much so as to call for proclamations against the cruelty'.

For the colony of New South Wales, patchy but valuable statistics on crimes and punishments are available from 1819. During the period 1819 to 1824, for example, trials for capital offences outnumbered larcenies and misdemeanors combined, by a factor of three to two. A majority of capital offences listed are so minor in nature according to today's laws that they would not warrant prison terms. Over 32 per cent of the prisoners were capitally convicted. And most importantly, almost 11 per cent of those found guilty were executed.

Compared to the following two years, the number of executions in 1823 and 1824 was far lower. In 1825 there were eleven executions, and in 1826 there were twenty-two. The administration of the colony of New South Wales was cognisant of this disparity. In 1826 the administration changed with the appointment of Governor Darling. In despatch 13, dated 2 February 1827 to Earl Bathurst, Governor Darling clarifies the disparity thus:

I will not omit the opportunity of acquainting your Lordship that the public tranquility continues undisturbed, and that the decrease of crime is very obvious.

The number of criminals sentenced to suffer death during the last year amounted to forty seven. Twenty two actually suffered. But no execution has taken place since the middle of October, a period of three months and a half. Considering the extent and composition of this community, these numbers are certainly not great; and I am most happy to find, the Criminal Court having just commenced its sittings, that the Calendar, as it is termed, contains very few cases of a serious nature.

Apparently that was not the view taken by the newspapers of the time; the *Monitor* in early 1827 referred to 'the consequent increase of crime since General Darling's arrival'. A note was written to prove the falsehood of this assertion, which stated the following:

Prisoners sentenced to suffer death in the years 1825 and 1826: For murder, 11,8; burglary, 15,8; rape, 2,0; felonies of various descriptions, 62,30; total, 90,46. Executed, 11,22.

The disproportion of the number, which suffered death in 1825 to the number sentenced is explained as follows. It appears to have been a principle during the last Administration to execute no man who had taken or attempted the life of another. Had this principle been acted on by me, eight only instead of twenty two would have been executed last year.

These accounts demonstrate how policy and statistics on crime and punishment are influenced by changes in administration. The higher execution rate continued; in 1827 and 1828 the number executed was 29 and 28 respectively. Between 1824 and 1828 there were on average thirty executions in Tasmania. As in New South Wales, a substantial number of executions were for crimes other than murder. What is notable is that during the period 1824 to 1830 between one-fourth and one-third of the individuals convicted in the supreme court were executed.


The number of convictions in the Supreme Court of New South Wales remained quite stable and in 1838 this was little over 200, but the number capitally convicted remained very high, six out of ten, and the level of executions declined. In Tasmania, convictions in the supreme court and the court of quarter sessions declined toward the late 1830s, as did the number of executions. But relative to the total population of the two colonies, supreme court convictions, imprisonment and execution rates were much higher in Tasmania than in New South Wales.

In the twentieth century attitudes to crime and punishment practices have changed dramatically and conditions in gaols have also improved, sometimes after spectacular protests by the prisoners themselves. The increase in the number of crimes reported in some categories, such as rape, reflects publicity about the importance of notifying police that a crime has been committed. The number of rapes reported in Australia increased from 416 in 1970 to 1297 in 1982. Dramatic increases in other categories such as breaking and entering (from 90 210 in 1970 to 211 664 in 1982) are often attributed to general social conditions, especially unemployment and drug abuse.




