Try not to encounter a global pandemic.

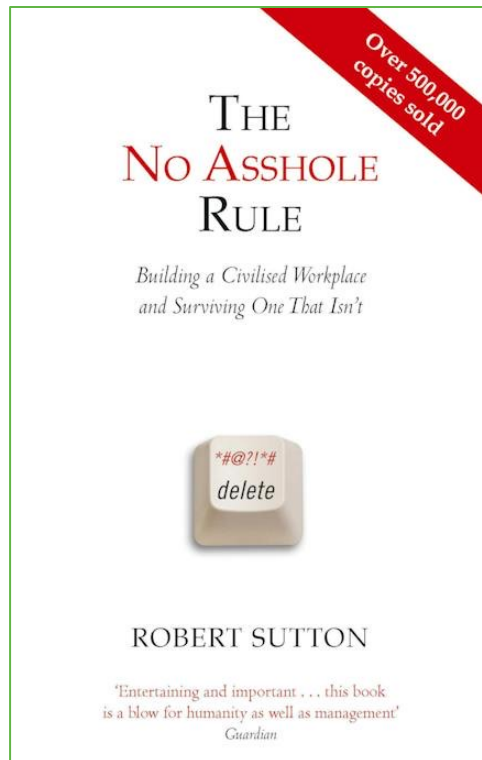
Choose your CIs and AIs wisely – do not ignore your gut instinct.
